Graduate Student Enrollment

Regular full-time graduate enrollment is 3 classes per Fall and Spring semester. If you work more than 30 hoursperweek and/or have addition at sponsibilities you may wish to take 12 classes per semester. Keep in mind that our program consists of regular reading, writing, and research assignments, and is more tiring tensive than most undergraduate programs.

Graduate students must enrolled at least4 credits a given semester beeligible for most financial aid, including federal loans. For MPA students, this equates to at least 2 courses per semester, as ach course in orth 3 credits.

Summerenrollment does notifiectpartime/full-time studentstatus. However, students should be aware that summer courses are offered in three sessions: Session 1, lasting the first half; Session 2, lasting the second half; and Session 3, lasting the full Summer semester.

Academic Calendar

Take note of the add/drop deadline for any semester in which you have enrolled in classes. Students must withdraw from a course by this deadline in order to receive a tuition refund. Students who do not withdraw from this deadline in order to receive a tuition refund.
